

Penodiad y Parchedig Rob Wardle fel Ficer ac Arweinydd Ardal Weinidogaeth i Fro Cybi.

Mae Esgob Bangor - y Gwir Barchedig Andy John - yn falch o gyhoeddi penodi'r Parchedig Robert Wardle fel Ficer ac Arweinydd Ardal Weinidogaeth Bro Cybi, sy'n gwasanaethu cymunedau Ynys Gybi - Caergybi, Bae Trearddur a Rhoscolyn - ar Ynys Môn. Mae Rob yn olynu'r Hybarch Andy Herrick, sy'n dod yn Ficer Cynorthwyol yn nhîm gweinidogaeth Bro Cybi, a fydd yn caniatáu iddo ganolbwyntio ei weinidogaeth fel Archddiacon Môn.

Mae Rob, ar hyn o bryd, yn aelod o dîm clerigwyr Gweinidogaeth Tîm Macclesfield.

Ganwyd Rob ym Manceinion, gan adael yr ysgol yn 16 oed i weithio yn y diwydiant adeiladu, ac yno y bu'n hunangyflogedig am y 31 mlynedd nesaf. Dechreuodd Rob ymddiddori mewn gwaith ieuentid pan dyfodd ei blant ei hun i'w harddegau, cyfnod a oedd yn digwydd cydreddeg â'i ddatblygiad yntau o ran ei ymrwymiad i'r ffydd.

Yn 2004 fe fentrodd gwneud cais i astudio yng Ngholeg Diwinyddol St John's yn Nottingham, gan lwyddo ennill gradd dosbarth cyntaf mewn gwaith ieuentid a chymunedol a diwinyddiaeth gymhwysol, gan sylweddoli fod ganddo'r gallu i wneud mwy na dim ond gwaith llaw!

Yn 2005, Rob oedd Cyfarwyddwr sefydlol rhaglen Ieuentid a Chymunedol Cre8, sydd wedi ei chydabod yn lleol ac yn genedlaethol am ei waith eang gyda phobl ifanc ac oedolion ar gyrion cymdeithas. Hyn fu'n graidd i'w weinidogaeth am y bymtheng mlynedd ddiwethaf.

Cyflwynodd Rob ei hun i'w ordeinio ac ymgymryd â hyfforddiant diwinyddol pellach yng Ngholeg King's yn Llundain. Hyd at yn ddiweddar, bu Rob yn byw a gweithio o fewn 14 milltir i ardal ei fagwraeth, er



Appointment of Rev'd Rob Wardle as Vicar and Ministry Area Leader for Bro Cybi

The Bishop of Bangor - the Right Reverend Andy John - is pleased to announce the appointment of the Reverend Robert Wardle as Vicar and Ministry Area Leader of the Bro Cybi Ministry Area, which serves the the communities of Holy Island - Holyhead, Trearddur Bay and Rhoscolyn - on Anglesey. Rob succeeds the Venerable Andy Herrick, who is becoming an Associate Vicar in the Bro Cybi ministry team, which will allow him to focus on his ministry as Archdeacon of Anglesey.

Rob is currently a member of the clergy team in Macclesfield Team Ministry.

Rob was born in Manchester and left school at 16 to work in the building trade, where he remained self-employed for the next 31 years. Rob began to take an interest in youth work when his own children were teenagers, which coincided with the growth of his own faith commitment.

In 2004 he took the plunge of applying to study at St John's Theological College in Nottingham, gaining a first class honours degree in youth and community work and applied theology and realising that he could more than just work with his hands!

In 2005 Rob was the founding Director of the Cre8 Youth and Community programme in Macclesfield, which has received local and national recognition for its wide-ranging work with marginalised young people and adults. This has been the core of his ministry for the last fifteen years.

Rob went forward for ordination and did further theological training at King's College in London. Until recently, Rob has always lived and worked within 14 miles of where he was born and brought up, although he has a long association

I'm looking forward to seeing how God is able to use Rob's creativity to bring the Good News to all the people of Ynys Cybi.
