Did you know?

- that assemblies have been taken or visits made to the following schools since September: Parchedig Thomas Ellis, Llaingoch, y Parc, Kingsland, Llanfawr and Rhoscolyn
- 20% of the stipendiary (paid) clergy on Anglesey are in our Ministry Area
- That Jane Bailey is the Chaplain to the Holyhead branch of the Royal British Legion
- That the Home Communion and Visiting team take communion to residential homes in Trearddur Bay and Holyhead
- That 35 people were involved in the Lent course in three different venues
- That Bro Cybi conducts on average 10% more baptisms than other Ministry Areas in the Church in Wales
- That Janet Waddington is Chaplain to Holyhead Sea Cadets
- That through Messy Church we have contact with around 26 families, who otherwise would have no connection with church
- That our contribution to the Diocese has gone down by 20% in 2015 primarily because of the generosity of other Ministry Areas on Anglesey

Bishop's make a formal pastoral visit to each Ministry Area once every three years, and on 21 April 2015, it is our turn.

Who is our Bishop?

The Right Reverend Andrew John was born near Aberystwyth and read law at Cardiff prior to ministerial training at St John's College in Nottingham (1986-89). He served in Cardigan and Aberystwyth as Assistant Curate followed by 7 years at Holy Trinity in the Rectorial Benefice of Aberystwyth. He moved to Aberaeron in 1999 and was appointed Archdeacon of Cardigan and vicar of Pencarreg (Cwmann) in 2006. He was elected Bishop and consecrated 81st in succession to Deiniol in 2008. His research interests include biblical studies and the works of Caravaggio. He is a regular contributor to the BRF New Daylight series. Andrew is married to Caroline and they have four children. He enjoys sport, art and music which varies from Arvo Part to Led Zeppelin.

What is a Bishop's Visit?

Bishop Andy is coming to take a temperature check of what life is like in the Ministry Area and in the four churches. He does this by meeting people. He will inevitably spend time with Kevin and the Ministry Team, the Ministry Area Wardens, people on various committees, but most of all he wants to meet the people of the four congregations that make up the one Church in Wales on Holy Island.

What will he be doing?
