We also hope devotional material will be given out across the congregations on Palm Sunday so we can journey intentionally together towards Easter and beyond.

WHAT IS A MINISTRY AREA?

The Church in Wales has stated 'the creation of "Ministry Areas" is one of the most radical changes we're making. They "reflect huge changes which have taken place in our society." The parish system, as originally set up with a single priest serving a small community, was put in place when people lived and worked in the same parish. All this has now changed - the communities to which people now belong are very varied and people travel freely."

Ministry Areas cover a broad geographical area. Rather than relying on individual clergy to minister to an increasing number of congregations, they are served by a mixed ministry team, some of whom are stipendiary ministers but most of whom are not. Some may be specialists in certain types of ministry, such as with young people or with those with little or no connection with the church"

A Ministry Area therefore is not the same as a Rectorial Benefice. We therefore need a model for operating that reflects the area of Holyhead, Trearrddur Bay and Rhoscolyn. Kevin has been working on such a model and it will be shared with the Wardens and PCC. It will be discussed formally at the Easter Vestry, so therefore the Vestry should be a red letter event for members of all four of our congregations. If passed, this new constitution will shape how we relate to each as four churches for years to come.

Easter Vestry

The Easter Vestry will be held on Tuesday 29 April 2014 in St Cybi's Church, Holyhead. The Vestry will begin with a Celebration of Holy Communion starting at 7pm.
