What and where is our stained glass window on this month's cover? Observant visitors to the Stanley Chapel in St Cybi often ask how and why two young men surnamed Stanley, in the prime of their lives, died on the same day 21st December 1947. Who were they? John aged 25, and Martin aged 23 were both officers in the Coldstream Guards and had served in WW2 with distinction, and survived. They were the two eldest sons of Lt. Colonel Oliver and Lady Kathleen Stanley. Their local family home was Plas Llanfawr, now demolished, a few hundred yards from the present Penrhos Stanley Hospital. Their father Lt. Col. Oliver had fought in the Boer War, lost a leg in WW1 and was a director of the company that made the Enigma computer. Their mother Lady Kathleen was the eldest daughter of the Marquis of Bath, with connections to the Longleat estate, so carried the title in her own right. The first baby Mary died young. There were two younger sons, Thomas and Richard. To celebrate Christmas 1947 John and Martin had been given Home Leave for the first time since the war. Brother Richard was home too. Tom, also a Guards officer was not on leave. On December 21st the three brothers went for a walk to the Penrhos sand dunes with a pet Jack Russell terrier. The dog went very deep down a rabbit hole and became stuck. The lads frantically dug a tunnel to rescue it, but the sand collapsed on John and Martin. Richard escaped but his frantic attempt to save them was unsuccessful. They would have died quite rapidly with the huge pressure on their chests. The whole town mourned this tragedy. The funeral service and burials took place in St Seiriols Church and churchyard. Because the 6th and 7th Barons had no sons, as first male cousin John was heir to the peerage. As a result of the deaths, eventually in 1971, Tom became the 8th Baron Thomas Stanley of Alderley. The window, installed in 1948, is beautiful with the pictures of St. John the Evangelist and St Martin the Centurion giving half of his cloak to a beggar. Below are the Stanley Coat of Arms. On the right is the shield with the motto Sans Change and on the left is the Crest- the Eagle and Child. The window is by Hugh Easton and at the bottom left hand corner is his famous signature, a weather vane with a cockerel. On the death of Lord Tom in 2013, his son Richard Oliver became the 9th Baron. He lives in Oxfordshire. Their other local connections are equally interesting. John and Martin were the great, great, great, great grand-sons of John and Margaret Owen, of the powerful and wealthy Penrhos family. It was their dominant, beautiful, wealthy granddaughter also called Margaret who married Sir John Thomas Stanley in 1763. There is a fitting tribute to John (died in 1712) and Margaret Owen on the memorial plaque to the left of our window. John and Martin were also the great grandsons of Edward John, 2nd Baron Stanley, twin brother of the Hon William Owen Stanley, whose magnificent marble memorial dominates the beautiful little chapel.
