**Interesting local history.** Ellin's Tower, high above the cliffs at South Stack, was a beautiful, but primitive summer house with no toilet or running water. It had been built between 1832 and 1850, by the Hon W.O. Stanley for the enjoyment of his beloved wife Ellin. After the death of both, between 1904 and 1914, the local Stanley family headed up by 4<sup>th</sup> Baron Stanley of Alderley, Edward Lyulph, (also entitled Lord Sheffield), father of Lt Col Oliver Stanley, kept a Visitors Book, signed by all who entered. Signatures in the amazing book range from local residents, holiday makers, early French and Irish nuns who first inhabited Le Bon Sauveur Convent, to famous historical figures in the world of politics. Personal friends of Oliver's sisters Sylvia, Blanche and Venetia, and just some of the signatories in the book, were Liberal Prime Minister Herbert Asquith and his daughter Violet, her future husband Principal Private Secretary Maurice Bonham Carter, Winston Churchill and the lady he married in 1908 - Clementine Ogilvy Hozier (He served as President of the Board of Trade, Home Secretary and First Lord of the Admiralty in Asquith's government before WW1). We wish to thank Ken Griffiths, one of our local historians, for some of this fascinating information. The Tower is now part of the RSPB area.
