What and where is our stained glass window on this month's cover?

Known as the North Transept window in St Cybi, if it looks a little unfinished, this is really interesting, as we have not met a living person who can remember it, and also there is no original photograph in existence. We do know that it was installed in 1922, into the north transept in St Cybi, by the Penrhos Bradwen family, who would have been agents on the Penrhos estate. They were prominent members of the Welsh congregation, and there is an inscribed floor memorial to them beside the pulpit in St Cybi. On the left, is featured the 'Good Shepherd', by Dearle and Morton and on the right is 'Charity' by Sir Edward Burne-Jones. The Lady Eleanor organ was installed in front of this magnificent window in 1932, because that was the only space large enough to house it. So how do we know this? During later church renovations, the window was removed and boxed away. All in one day, stained glass specialists worked from outside and behind the organ, carefully removing the damaged lights and every scrap of broken glass they could find. They then closed all the open parts, sealing them against the elements to protect the organ. They had a light box with them so they photographed the two damaged windows and the pieces of loose glass. They then boxed the window. We are fortunate in having computer generated images of this work. Like a jigsaw puzzle, the largest pieces were initially set in place, with smaller pieces following on. Variations of the window paintings in other churches by the same designers were found on the internet and used as a guide. The initial work was done by historian Dr Ken Roberts, and his friend George Lewis, a computer expert, polished up the resulting image for all to see. The window is badly damaged, but the digital reconstruction gives an idea of the beauty and depth of colour. It is hoped that in the future, money can be raised to carry out the restoration so that it can be exhibited in a light box on the west wall. We are grateful to Dr Ken both for the initial work and for providing this interesting information about our 'mystery window', and to George for his expertise.

They are easily repositioned. Find them whenever the church is open. £5-50 each, or two for £10.

Interesting historical January dates! On the 3rd in 1809, Louis Braille was born in France. Blinded as a boy, he later invented a reading system for the blind using punch marks in paper. On the 3rd in 1412 Joan of Arc was born in France. After a series of mystic visitations by saints, she inspired French troops to break the British siege at Orleans and win several important victories during the Hundred Years' War (1337-1453) between France and Britain. She was eventually captured and sold to the British who tried her for heresy and burned her at the stake, aged 19. In 1920, Joan of Arc was canonized a saint by the Roman Catholic Church. On the 7th in 1714 - A patent was issued for the first typewriter designed by British inventor Henry Mill "for the impressing or transcribing of letters singly or progressively one after another, as in writing." On the 26th in 1788 - The British established a settlement at Sydney Harbour in Australia as 11 ships with 778 convicts arrived, setting up a penal colony to relieve overcrowded prisons in England.
