What do we show on this month's cover? We show a New Year's greetings card! We may have sung "Auld Lang Syne", at various social gatherings over the years, - but what does it mean and where did it start? It started life as a Scottish folk song, and roughly translates as days gone by." Robbie Burns is credited with adapting and partially re-writing it in the 18 century, and it is used today as a call to remember friends and experiences from the past. Who were the first to create New Year's resolutions, which these days can involve getting into better shape, discarding a bad habit or learning a new skill? Believe it or not, the ancient Babylonians, nearly 4000 years ago made promises to earn the favour of their gods, and to start the New Year on the right foot! They would allegedly promise to pay off debts and to return borrowed farm equipment. If they kept their promises, their pagan gods would bestow favours on them for the coming year. But if these promises were broken, they would be in serious trouble! Romulus, the original founder of Rome, in the 8th century BC, set the start of the new year to coincide with the spring equinox. However, in 46 BC, having consulted with the most renowned and respected astrologers and mathematicians of the day, Julius Caesar established January 1st as New Year- - the month named after Janus, the two headed god of beginnings, who looks back at the old year and forward to the new! In the Christian calendar, Jan 1st occurs eight days after the birth of Christ, which in Jewish tradition, is the day on which every male child was to be formally named and circumcised. The name Jesus had already been decided by the angel, at the announcement of Mary's pregnancy. According to the Hebrew bible, circumcision had been everlastingly covenanted with God, by Abraham for his descendents and their slaves, as a rite of passage for Jewish baby boys, to be carried out by a specially trained Rabbi. In modern times, the Christian sacrament of baptism is seen to be accepted as a replacement practice for this original "covenant of grace" We wish a Happy New Year to all our readers!

Interesting January Dates: On the 1^{st,}, in 1449, Lorenzo de Medici (known as Lorenzo the Magnificent) was born in Florence, Italy. On the 3rd in 1922, English explorer Howard Carter discovered the tomb of Tutankhamun in the Valley of the Kings, near Luxor in Egypt.
