Saints Days July 2016

03: Thomas—Apostle: Although Thomas is mentioned in all the gospels, he appears most significantly in John. After the Resurrection, he was known as doubting Thomas, because he was unconvinced that Christ had actually risen. Jesus personally showed him the wounds in His hands and side. Thomas acclaims the risen Christ by saying, 'My Lord and my God' - which is the great climax to John's gospel.

22: Mary Magdalene: She has a unique place amongst Christ's followers, and is mentioned in all four gospels. She was probably from Magdala, by the sea of Galilee, and was healed by Jesus before becoming a follower. She stayed by the cross during the Crucifixion, and was the first to discover the empty tomb on Easter morning. She was privileged to be the first to see the risen Lord, who sent her to tell the good news to the other disciples.

25: James—Apostle: Often called "the great", he was a Galilean fisherman, who with his brother John, was one of the first apostles to be called to follow Jesus. Both brothers were with Jesus at the Transfiguration, and also in the garden of Gethsemane. They also witnessed the appearances after the Resurrection. James was put to death by the sword in 44AD, on the order of Herod Agrippa.
