From the feedback I and my colleagues have received from you; our future Church, in addition to having regular worship in the building, may include some of these things:

- a structured telephone ministry for those who are unable to attend Church
- virtual MAC meetings
- enabling people to pray and to study scripture at home
- additional non-eucharistic services
- Churches open for private prayer
- outdoor services

- risk assessments for a Covid free Church
- stewards for when we are open for private prayer
- people to hand-deliver mailings
- IT skilled people to help continue and to grow the virtual and recorded services for people who are unable to attend Church – and for mission

If you are able to help with any of these things then please do get in touch, as always please keep each other firmly held in prayer, just as God never lets go of any of us, we will continue to love and care for each other.
