What do we show on this month's cover? The magnificent east window ,behind the altar of St Cybi, showing scenes of the Resurrection of Christ. The central panel of the three light window, shows the figure of the risen Christ in glory, complete with nail wounds in hands and feet. Below is the empty tomb, with soldiers sleeping soundly, quite oblivious that it is miraculously empty. In the left hand panel, the lower light shows Peter and John visiting the empty tomb, amazed by what they see. In the right hand panel, the lower light shows the three women called Mary being greeted by two angels. Mary Magdalene in red can be seen listening to the angel, her pot of precious oil beside her. We also see the linen cloth which wrapped the body, and which now has been cast aside. In the tracery lights at the top of the window, can be seen curly haired angels carrying scrolls with texts. The smaller lights are richly decorated with coloured centrepieces and floral motifs. The window, installed in 1897 by the studio of Charles Eamer Kempe, (1837 – 1907), was given in memory of William Watson, who died in 1883. He was the chairman and managing director of the City of Dublin Steam Packet Company. A man of the highest integrity, and a Christian in the truest sense of the word, the principal achievement of his life was the establishment of the improved mail and passenger service between Great Britain and Ireland, which he oversaw for twenty three years. His original wish was to have taken Holy Orders, but circumstances made this impossible. Ironically, the window designer Kempe also initially considered a vocation to the priesthood. After it became clear that his severe stammer would be an impediment to preaching, Kempe decided that "if I was not permitted to minister in the Sanctuary I would use my talents to adorn it". This window is the one most photographed by visitors. We are grateful to John Cave for the magnificent image.

A former Bishop of Bangor, the Rt Rev Francis James Saunders Davies, who died on Good Friday 2018, aged 80, began his 40 year ministry as a curate in Holyhead. His whole ministry, which spanned forty years, happened within the Church in Wales. His journey progressed from Curate to Rector, to minor Canon, to Vicar, to Rural Dean, to Archdeacon and finally to Bishop. During the latter years of his life, he suffered increasingly from Parkinson's Disease. May he rest in peace!

Interesting historical May dates ! On the 4th, in 1494, during his second journey of exploration in the New World, Christopher Columbus discovered Jamaica. On the 7th composer Johannes Brahms (1833-1897) was born in Hamburg, Germany. On the 12th, British nurse and public health activist Florence Nightingale (1820-1910) was born in Florence, Italy. She volunteered to aid British troops in Turkey where she improved hospital sanitary conditions and greatly reduced the death rate for wounded and sick soldiers. She contributed to the development of modern nursing procedures, and emphasized the dignity of nursing as a profession for women. On the 14th, German physicist Gabriel Fahrenheit (1686-1736) was born in Danzig, Germany. He introduced the use of mercury in thermometers and greatly improved their accuracy. On the 28th in 1961 - Amnesty International was founded by London lawyer Peter Berenson, after reading about the arrest of a group of students in Portugal he launched a one-year campaign to free them.
