What do we show on this month's cover? This exquisite Victorian memorial in St Cybi's Church, sculpted to the memory of the Hon. W. O. Stanley, is not, as is widely believed, his tomb. Many of the Owen family of Penrhos, and many of the Stanley family, are actually buried in the transept beneath the magnificent Lady Eleanor organ. The life size angels are breath takingly beautiful, with their delicately formed garments, faces and limbs, persuaded into life from the unyielding Italian marble of Carrara, by the talented hand of the sculptor. We know of William Owen Stanley's legacies to the town: Stanley Hospital, Stanley Street, Stanley Embankment, Stanley Almshouses and Ellin's Tower, but who was this man? In 1802, William was born the younger twin son of John, Ist Baron Stanley of Alderley in Cheshire, so the elder twin Edward inherited the title of 2nd Baron Stanley of Alderley, while William became "The Hon." Older residents of the town will remember Lady Kathleen Stanley: her husband Lt Col. Oliver Stanley was Edward's grandson. William however inherited the local Penrhos family land, and in turn became a Liberal M.P, Lord Lieutenant of Anglesey, historian and archeologist. It was due to his humanitarian instinct, his foresight and business acumen in 1855, that the street traders of Holyhead, who then worked in the open air in all weathers, in the area currently around the Millenium Cross, known as Market Square, were offered places in the then newly built Market Hall – Holyhead's first public building. This has been re-furbished and recently re-opened as a magnificent library, business and tourism hub. William Owen Stanley died in 1884. Before her death in 1876, his wife Ellin had already commissioned the Stanley chapel, in St Cybi, to be designed by Sir Gilbert Scott to the memory of her husband. The chapel was completed in 1897, under the supervision of their niece Jane Henrietta Adeane. Who created this marble mas**terpiece**? Sir William Hamo Thornycroft (1850 – 1925) was an English sculptor, whose father, mother and grandfather were also distinguished in that craft. His three sisters were also talented artists. Hamo was responsible for some of London's best-known statues: Oliver Cromwell, (outside the Palace of Westminster), General Gordon, (on the Victoria Embankment), Lot's Wife, (Victoria and Albert Museum): as well as Alfred, Lord Tennyson (Trinity College Cambridge) and Alfred the Great (Winchester). He was a keen student of classical sculpture and became one of the youngest members of the Royal Academy, winning their gold medal in 1876. This is a magnet which draws visitors from all over the world, and they are never disappointed! Thanks to Chris Medley, for the stunning image!

As always with any sort of building project, there are unexpected costs. The St Cybi Restoration work is no exception. We are therefore delighted that Tesco have allowed us to collect again from their very generous customers, on Saturday, 16th November. Remembrance Sunday—Sun 10th November—10.0am united service for all churches at St Cybi – followed by the traditional cenotaph parade. It's great to see the black perspex military figures in the church grounds again, generously sponsored by the British Legion!

Interesting historical November dates. On the 4th in 1862, Richard Gatling patented his first rapid-fire machine-qun which used revolving barrels rotating around a central mechanism to load, fire, and extract the cartridges. On the 6th in 1429. Henry VI was crowned King of England at age eight. He had acceded to the English throne at the age of nine months following the death of his father Henry V, and to the throne of France after the death of his maternal grandfather Charles VI. On the 9th in 1918. German Kaiser Wilhelm II abdicated his throne in the closing days of World War I and fled to Holland. In Germany, Philip Scheidemann, a Socialist leader, then proclaimed a democratic Republic and became its first Chancellor. On the 11th in 1918, at 5 a.m., in Marshal Foch's railway car in the Forest of Compiegne, the Armistice between the Allied and Central Powers was signed, silencing the guns of World War I effective at 11 a.m. – the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. On the 18th in 1477, William Caxton printed the first book in the English language, *The* Dictes and Sayengis of the Phylosophers. On the 19th, Charles I, King of Scotland and England (1600-1649) was born. He ruled from 1625-49. He maintained the Divine Right of Kings to rule and opposed Parliament's challenges to his authoritarian style. This resulted in civil war and his eventual execution, followed by the establishment of a Commonwealth with Oliver Cromwell as Lord Protector. On the 22nd, in 1963, at 12:30 p.m., in downtown Dallas, 35th US President John F. Kennedy was shot in the back, then in the head. At 1 p.m, he was pronounced dead. On the 28th in 1919, Lady Nancy Astor was elected as the first female in the British House of Commons.
