What do we show on this month's cover? On the left, we see Neil Ridings, after receiving his licence from our Bishop Andy, to return to the parish as Associate Priest, where he started his Diocesan curacy all those years ago. We welcome him 'home' to our ministry area, but who is the man within the "dog collar"? Most parishioners remember his sermons as being 'entertaining'. He is a self confessed "normal bloke", and even the children in the schools within his previous ministry area described him as "not like a normal vicar!" When he was younger, he had two ambitions: either to be a teacher or a footballer! For a few years he sort of combined the two, discovering that he could more easily connect with his students in their Manchester classroom via the football pitch! Always concerned to help those on the margins of society, he helped run the soup kitchen in the Didsbury church in Manchester which he attended while teaching. He is passionate that there should be fairness in life and that those who are unjustly treated be absorbed back into society. Finally, an excess of administrative paperwork within the educational system proved to be the last straw, and teaching's loss proved to be the church's gain! As a football fan, he supports Manchester City, and used to play until fairly recently. When asked which person alive or dead he would wish to share a pint with, he said John Hegley (no - I hadn't heard of him either!) Neil has actually met at a gig in Manchester, this sixty four year old performance poet, who is also a stand up comedian and regularly appears in the Edinburgh Fringe. John writes his own songs, but the greater appeal is his excellent delivery of the reading of his own poetry, his use of language, his imagination and his unique comedic genre. Neil plays a quitar and his musical tastes appear to span the 80s and 90s, from classic Britpop through punk into alternative rock, soul, ska and reggae. A favourite rock band is 'The Smiths', formed in Manchester in the 80s, and he has tickets for a November date in the 2018 UK tour, to enjoy the work of their quitarist Johnny Marr. Neil is a 'real ale man,' and enjoys experimental cooking, and eating either Chinese or Indian. He and his wife Kay, love to walk and explore, near the sea or by rivers. He enjoys coarse fishing in lakes, but always puts them back! So in addition to our guitar and piano playing vicar, we now have a guitar playing associate priest. <u>Interesting historical September dates</u>! On the 1<sup>st</sup> in 1715, the "Sun King" (King Louis XIV of France) died. He had ruled since the age of five and was succeeded by his 5-year-old great-grandson Louis XV. On the 4<sup>th</sup> in 1781, Los Angeles was founded by the Spanish Governor of California, Felipe de Neve, near the site of the Native American village of Yang-na. The original name was El Pueblo de la Reina de Los Angeles (The Town of the Queen of the Angels). On the 5<sup>th</sup> in 1997, Mother Teresa died in Calcutta at age 87, after a life of good works spent aiding the sick and poor in India through her Missionaries of Charity order. On the 9<sup>th</sup> in 1776, the United States came into existence as the Continental Congress changed the name of the new American nation from the United Colonies. On the 9th in 1948, following the withdrawal of Soviet forces from North Korea, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea was proclaimed with Pyongyang as its capital. On the 18th in 1810, Chile declared its independence from Spain after 269 years as a colony. On the 18<sup>th</sup>international superstar Greta Garbo (1905-1990) was born in Stockholm, Sweden (as Greta Lovisa Gustafsson). She became a recluse ('I want to be alone') after making 27 films, spanning the silent era through the beginning of sound movies. In 1941, at the age of 36, Garbo announced a "temporary" retirement. It lasted 49 years, until her death in 1990 in Manhattan, where she lived alone. She never married and had no children.

A <u>Golden wedding</u> was happily celebrated in St Cybi on 5 Aug, by Chris and May Horrocks (nee Davies) who had returned from Virginia, USA to the church where they were married. As well as performing in their local church with the bell ringing troupe, they also sing in their church choir. We pray that they may enjoy many more years of happiness.
