What do we show on this month's cover? Walk part way down the central aisle of St Cybi's Church, and look upwards to the wooden ceiling. If your eye sight is good, you will see a wood carving of the Eagle and Child. The tradition of a child being found unharmed in an eagle's nest is very old and exists in folklore in many parts of Europe, notably in Norway and France. So what has this legend to do with St Cybi's Church? The Eagle and Child was the crest of our historic local aristocratic family, the Stanleys, The family was allegedly descended from Charlemagne the Great, Emperor of the Romans from 800 AD, who came over as part of the army of William the Conquerer, in 1066. We understand that Sir John Stanley (1380-1421) married the heiress Isobel de Lathom. As there was much unconfirmed speculation and rumour, of both infidelity and illegitimacy, and various accounts of the origin of this "eagle and child" story within the Lathom family, suffice it to say that this crest was acquired by the Lathom family, from Henry 4, in 1405, and passed into Stanley ownership at the time of Isabel's marriage! Their great grandson Sir Thomas Stanley, married Lady Margaret Beaufort, mother of Henry Tudor (7th). The Eagle and Child Inn, near the Cenotaph at Holyhead, was built around 1770, on part of the local Stanley family estate. This was the starting point for coaches making the 48 hour journey to London, via Chester, During the 1840s, it was considered to be the principal hostelry in the town. In the 1880s, the hotel closed, and the building was turned into residences. Over time, much has been demolished; the only part now standing is the solicitors' practice known as T R Evans Hughes and Co. Thanks to Chris Medley for the image, and to Lady Carla, wife of Richard, 9th Lord Stanley of Alderley, for the family tree.

Interesting historical September dates. On the 3<sup>rd</sup>, in 1658, Oliver Cromwell died suddenly in the Palace of Westminster, from complications following a bout of malaria, common in Western Europe at the time. He was 59, and was buried in Westminster Abbey. However, when Charles II regained the throne in 1660, his Royalist followers dug up Cromwell's corpse, hung it in chains and beheaded it. On the 6<sup>th</sup>, in 1991, Leningrad was renamed Saint Petersburg by Russian legislators following the collapse of the Soviet Union, Russia's second largest city had been known as Leningrad for 67 years in honour of Vladimir Lenin, founder of the Soviet Union. On the 11th, in 2001, to be known forever as 9/11, the worst terrorist attack in U.S. history occurred as four large passenger jets were hijacked then crashed, killing in total nearly 3,000 persons. On the 14th, in 1812, Napoleon and his troops first entered Moscow as the retreating Russians set the city on fire. Napoleon found it was impossible to stay through the winter in the ruined city. He then began a retreat from Moscow which became one of the great disasters of military history. Fewer than 20,000 of the original 500,000 men with him survived the Russian campaign. On the 24th, puppeteer Jim Henson (1936-1990) was born in Greenville, Mississippi, He created the Muppets, including Kermit the Froq, and Bert and Ernie, entertaining and educating generations of children via the daily TV show Sesame Street.
