We continue this month, with our spotlight on a selection of our magnificent stained glass windows, from all our churches.

What is the window on this month's cover and where can you find it?

'Christ watching over a Boy Scout' was given in memory of Francis James Bell (1892-1980) and his wife Florence Mary Isobel Bell (1893-1974). It was originally commissioned and installed into the Church of St Seiriol in 1982, by Celtic Studios, and was reset into the north aisle wall of St Cybi's in 1998, following the demolition of St Seiriol's. The Maltese Cross represents Frank's many years as a dedicated St John's Ambulance Officer. He was also highly regarded as a Vicar's warden and Sunday School Superintendant. Senior members of our congregation fondly remember the organised Sunday School trips to Llandudno and Rhyl, always by a special train! An efficient trade union leader, during the war years he organised the railway firemen. Shipwrecked mariners and distressed seamen had reason to be grateful for his services; he was also the secretary of the local lifeboat crew. The dominant image of a boy scout in the window, speaks volumes of how he is mostly remembered—as a well respected scout leader! The idea of the Boy Scouts Association was initially outlined nationally in 1908, and was finally launched by Sir Robert Baden Powell in 1910 on his retirement from the army as Lieutenant General. However, in 1909 in Holyhead, 120 would-be scouts turned up for an initial meeting, along with adult men interested in becoming scout masters. By 1911, only Frank Bell of the adult males remained, so the group was initially known as 'Bells Own'. An area near the Breakwater Country Park was the favourite local place for camping, and to this day is referred to as 'Scouts Glen'. Summer 'away' camps were memorable. As no one had a van, a large trek cart with wooden wheels was invaluable. In order to get scouts and gear from Holyhead to Beaumaris, the cart was loaded up at Scout's Hall and trundled to Holyhead railway station. The load was dismantled and put onto the train, along with the cart and boys. Arriving at Menai Bridge station on the mainland, gear and cart were unloaded, reassembled and pushed over the suspension bridge and on towards Beaumaris. The braking system was a series of ropes hauled by the bigger scouts. True initiative indeed! The cart was also used for the benefit of the local community, to transport furniture etc, on a 'good deed' basis.
