We are committed to doing everything we can to support each other even when we are unable to gather in our church buildings in the ways we are used to.

This coming Sunday the 4<sup>th</sup> of October we will be celebrating Harvest in Bro Cybi. We will have services at both St Cybi's and St Ffraid's at 11am. Twit and another lamb called Molly will be on their way to a new home near Bangor on Sunday, so they are stopping off at St Cybi's on the way. The lambs have been such a blessing this year.

In other news, we have received new guidance from the Church in Wales about opening our Church Halls, it may soon be possible for us to re-start some of our community activities which is really good news. Hopefully this may allow us to regain some income lost over the past months.
